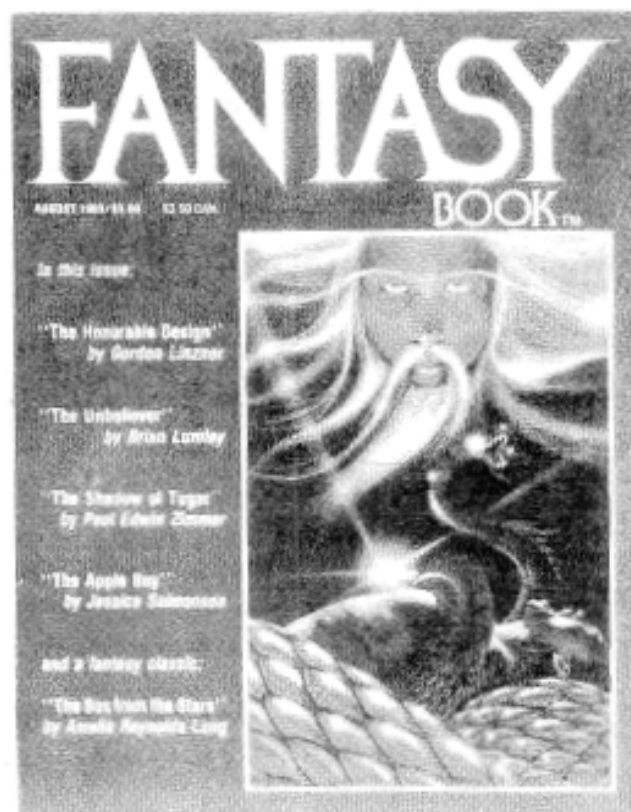

HOW TO ASSIGN SERIAL NUMBERS

Assigning serial numbers to "ACTIVE DUTY" members in STARFLEET is really quite easy. Sometimes it takes a little imagination, especially if you live overseas, but essentially anybody can do it.

In STAR TREK, Kirk's serial number was: SC 937-0176 CEC

You start with the root number 937-0176. In our case we will use a member's basic telephone number. Perhaps Kirk's telephone number at his apartment in San Francisco is 937-0176. Who knows?

In any event, we must then add a suffix and prefix code to make the serial number complete. In STARFLEET there are three (3) basic prefix codes. Those codes are divided into the three general divisions of organization. They are:

	area of organization	including	prefix code
1.	COMMAND	Captain, usually First Officer, Helmsman, Security, etc.	SC
2.	SUPPORT SERVICES	Engineering, Operations, Communications, etc.	SE
3.	SCIENCES	All sciences including Medical	S

Sometimes it is easy to remember the prefix codes according to which people wore the gold shirts (SC), the red shirts (SE), and the blue shirts (S) in the television series. Under new organization in STARFLEET, however, the security details might be wearing gold shirts (SC) if the old uniform color codes were still in effect. This type of change is up to you as captain of your own ship. In the STAR TREK motion pictures, uniform color codes were divided up into white (Command), orange (Science), red (Engineering and support), gold (Operations), grey (Security), and green (Medical). In the WRATH OF KHAN the color codes were slightly altered again! Therefore it is up to you to decide which fields fit under Command (SC), Support Services (SE), and the Sciences (S), because those are the three general prefix codes which will be used in STARFLEET.

SUFFIX CODES

Suffix codes come at the end of the serial number and are much more difficult to determine. Unlike the prefix code which is "general" in character, the suffix code is very specific. The suffix code represents the precise "position" held by an individual member. The number of possible positions held by a STARFLEET member are infinite and may change from one ship to another. One captain may determine that "positions" aboard another ship may not be necessary on his/her ship and vice versa. The following list is "suggested" as a reference for possible "positions" aboard starships and their corresponding suffix code. If a position aboard your ship is listed below, then the given code is "recommended", but not required. Likewise, if a position is not listed, feel free to make up your own code, but please try not to duplicate codes already given below, if you can possibly manage it. This way STARFLEET can maintain at least some kind of consistency between the several chapters. Your cooperation is appreciated.

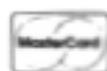
