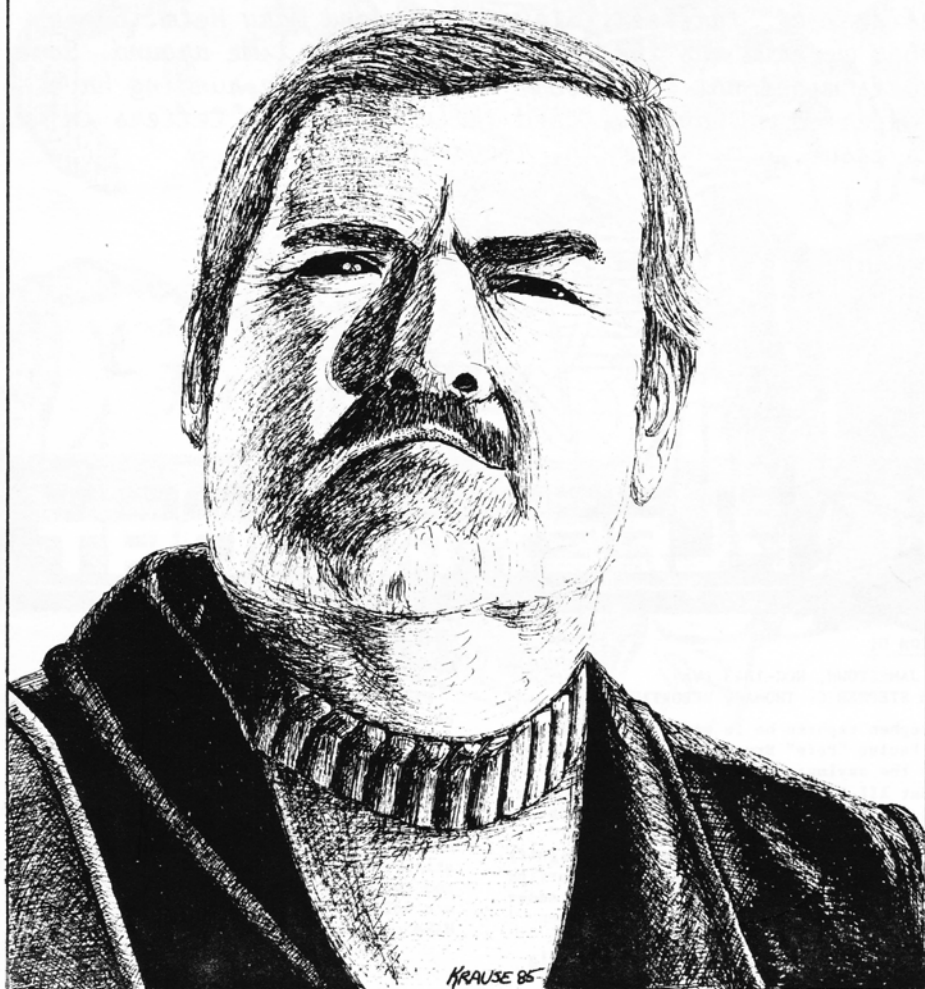

CMDR. CECILE SAVERCOOL, REPORTING.

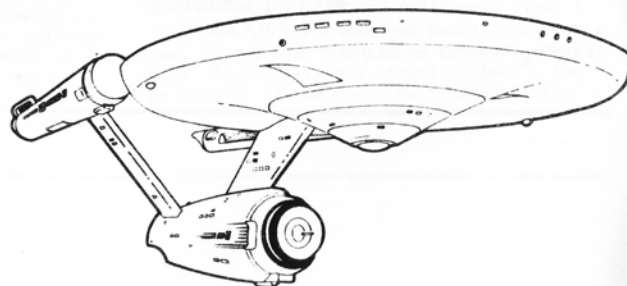

The sets are all gone, the costumes and props tightly held onto by those lucky few who were able to get them. "The Galileo" is the only Star Trek relic still around and available. 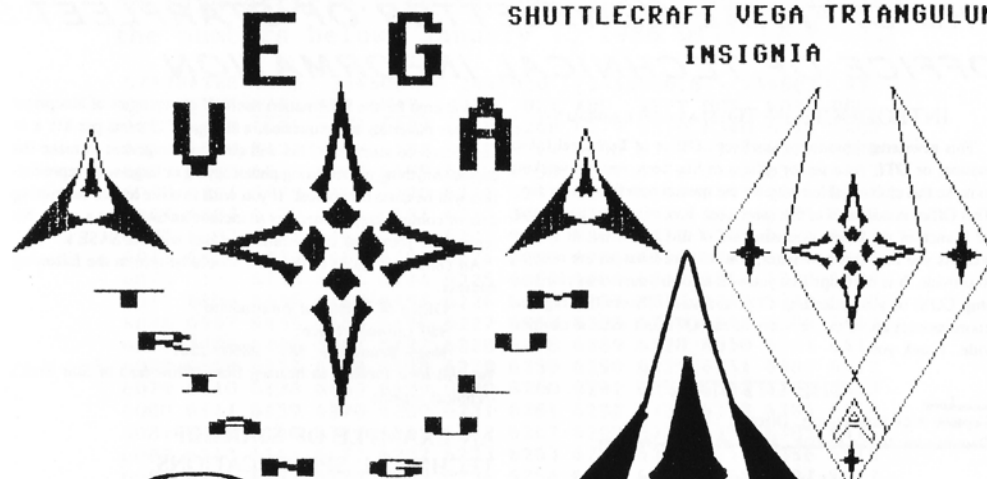

INTRODUCTION TO DATA READOUT

This newsletter introduces Starfleet's Office of Technical Information, or OTI. As a senior officer in Starfleet, you are working to make this club a viable entity for the mutual benefit of many fans. This Office is dedicated to that same goal. It is, of course, a specialized branch of the Fleet, operating (as of this issue) out of Region VII. As you read this newsletter, you will see what we are offering to provide. It is our hope that you will inform your crews (for starship CO's) or your attending CO's and staff officers (for regional coordinators) about the services of the OTI and what it can provide. WHAT IS THE OTI?

The OTI, Starfleet's Office of Technical Information, is a reference and research service that deals primarily in the technical aspects of Star Trek. The staff of the OTI has access to a great deal of Star Trek's technical diagrams and other paraphernalia. In essence, we will answer questions and provide data on Star Trek's ships, uniforms, equipment, etc. Also, we will critique original technical ly oriented materials, if we are given copies to examine. Additionally, we can provide aid in their development.

The OTI can also provide the names and addresses of various companies which stock blueprints, either as part of their stock, or as their sole operation. If we are asked, we will review individual prints or the overall style of firms or artists.

In addition to dealing with blueprints, technical manuals, etc., the OTI will answer questions of a technical nature which arise from novels and stories. Many of these introduce new concepts. The OTI is working to make all of the varying concepts fit together. Suggested explanations of technical questions will also be welcome. Persons who send them in will certainly receive replies in which the staff (usually the director) will discuss the explanation with the sender and add commentary.

Any individuals who hear about new blueprints or technical materials can help the OTI in its function by forwarding such information to the director. Persons who have completed their own materials should also get in touch with the Office. If they sound interesting, there is a possibility that they could be purchased.

At present, the OTI has developed only 2 pieces of original work. One project is a set of sketches of refitted versions of the *Saladin*-class destroyer and the *Ptolemy*-class transport/tug. These are available from the OTI. Inquiries will be accepted concerning prices. The other is a floor-plan of the bridge as rearranged for Star Trek II. This item is available upon request.

DEALING WITH THE OTI

The OTI will take any and all communications, from any member of Starfleet or even from non-Fleet sources. The basic requirement for all dealings is an SASE. The staff is not rich, and we cannot afford the postage necessary to handle large volumes of replies. There

is no charge for the information itself. If photocopies of blueprints or other materials are requested, a charge of 15 cents per 8 1/2 x 11 sheet must be tendered. This will cover our expenses to make the copies. Anything not requiring photocopying or large-scale reproduction will be done for no cost. If you wish to write letters submitting data or commentary, remember to include an SASE for a reply. No replies are promised for communications without SASE's.

GENE RODDENBERRY 1ST WRITER NAMED FOR H'W'D WALK OF FAME

Gene Roddenberry, creator of "Star Trek," has been chosen as the first writer to be honored in the 26-year history of the Hollywood Walk of Fame. Roddenberry is one of 23 honorees selected as recipients of sidewalk stars for the fiscal year 1985-86.

To date, 1805 stars have been dedicated. Only 700 remaining stars are available for designation.

Among personalities to be honored posthumously are Steve McQueen, Billie Holiday and Smiley Burnette.

McQueen and Burnette are among seven motion picture stars to be honored. The others are Harrison

Ford, Shirley Jones, Bugs Bunny, pioneer stuntman and former western star Yakima Canutt, and George Peppard, also a tv star.

Television honorees include Tom Selleck, Linda Evans, Roddenberry, Glen Larson, Harry Ackerman and Gary Collins. Recording personalities to be ushered into the Walk of Fame, in addition to Holiday, are Diahann Carroll, Bette Midler, Sarah Vaughan and Julio Iglesias.

Representing live theater will be Joel Grey and John Houseman, although both work in films and tv as well. Radio is to be memorialized with sidewalk stars for Chick Hearn, Dick Van Patten (better known for tv) and the team of Al Lohman & Roger Barkley.

Walk of Fame chairman Johnny Grant said that star ceremonies will be conducted June 26 for Ackerman, July 17 for Peppard, July 31 for Vaughan, Aug. 14 for Canutt, Sept. 18 for Collins, and Nov. 11 for Iglesias. Dates are to be announced on 1986 dedications for the remainder.
