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NOTICE OF DATA BREACH



This notice is to inform you of data security incidents that involved a limited amount of your personal information. This notice will give an overview of what happened, and what we are doing in response.

WHAT HAPPENED?

On 1/1/2023 all Database permissions for previous administration staff were removed.

On 1/ (exact date(s) pending: estimated end of week 1)/2023 the new administration did an SFDPP audit on chapters. It was found many CO's and XO's were out of compliance. When the database privileges were being removed for those not in compliance, it became known that several of these individuals had database permissions that far exceeded what they should have in their current roles. A spreadsheet was made by CompOps member and VRC9 Ivar Bardie of all current permissions in the database and who they were assigned to. This was audited and the individual permissions were removed from Fleet members who should not have them by Ivar via the back end of the database.

On 1/30/23 REDACTED interviewed with REDACTED for the position of REDACTED. During that interview, **REDACTED** makes remarks about their enhanced database access that caused pause. As they no longer hold any position outside of CO of REDACTED. this alarms REDACTED and they reported this to the administration. Looking into this, they had many accesses they should not, including "superuser" access. These permissions were removed, and had been removed prior, however they kept reverting back. On 2/12 all individual database permissions were wiped, and only packages remained for all users.

2/22/23 Our server notified us that there were spikes in our database around 2:00am eastern. As this can indicate that there could potentially be unauthorized access to our server, and coupled with the fact that database permissions seems to be given out at random, the InfoServ team started to investigate the reasons for the spike.

2/9/2023 there was an email from Linode at 2am indicating there was an average 200% load spikes on the medusa server.

2/26/2023 It was suggested by InfoServ department member Scott Sawyer (post graduate degree in cyber security) to do a controlled penetration test of our own server by the InfoServ team (basically "hack" into our own server).

2/26/2023 This report went out to the CS/VCS.

3/02/2023 The server logs for user REDACTED were acquired by Tony Knopes from when they left their REDACTED position on 1/1/23 to the end of January. These are the findings of unauthorized use of the database:

3/2/2023 Notification of these findings was sent to the CS/VCS.

3/08/23 Full data logs have been acquired by Tony Knopes for all database access from this member for the last year.

3/08/23 Full patch of vulnerability was completed and tested multiple times.

3/08/2023 AB notified of Data Breach.

3/12/2023 Membership was notified about the Data Breach via social media. A script for a new program the CS was due to air was edited to provide the opportunity to allow members to ask questions with transparency.

WHAT WE ARE DOING:

Your confidentiality, privacy, and security of information that we retain is among our highest priorities, and we take this incident very seriously. Upon becoming aware of these events, we immediately launched an investigation. We have ensured that the member cannot access our database information. We have enhanced the security controls tools on our database servers to help prevent an event like this from happening again. We will continue to monitor our servers and do routine penetration tests to identify additional safeguards and weaknesses. We are now going through log files to see which members' data was accessed by this individual in the last few years. Any member whose information was

accessed without justification will be notified personally, and it will be included in our report to authorities.

We also reviewed our security policies and enhanced procedures to reduce the risk of similar future events.

WHAT YOU CAN DO:

We have no evidence at this time that your information was misused. Your personal information that could have potentially been accessed would include your name, email, date of birth, and address. While the possibility of identity theft is minimal, we would encourage you to be vigilant and to report any suspicious activity.

FOR MORE INFORMATION:

STARFLEET International deeply regrets that this has occurred, and we are taking this matter extremely seriously. Protecting the privacy and security of your personal information is our top priority. Please accept our sincere apologies, and know that we will do whatever it takes for this to not ever happen again. REPORT: COMMANDER, STARFLEET

Fleet Admiral David Nottage, SCC 28197



Greetings to the Membership, one and all!

It has been a very interesting first sixty-plus days, and in some respects fun. I want to share with you what's going on within STARFLEET so far. Individual departments will share their operational details.

As of today, the Administration has completed or is still working on:

SFDPP AUDIT

The audit has been completed and we are now in a compliance phase. We stand at 33 chapters out of compliance, down from 46 a few weeks ago, and will only improve by the time of this publication. The Regional Coordinators have been of great help in taking us this far. There will be more to come soon on SFDPP. The Accelerated Program is in place with shorter TIS reductions. The new timeline will allow for better long-term growth of a chapter by ensuring stability of the incoming chapters. On April 2, chapters still on stand by for being out of handbook compliance will be placed on Drydock. Timelines are specified in the Membership Handbook. Note that for those regions in election mode this will affect your voting criteria.

REVIEW OF SFDPP PROTOCOLS AND CERTIFICATION PROCESSES

Due to the SFDPP review and recent issues with permissions we sadly have approximately 26 chapters in standby status. On April 2, if they haven't come into compliance they will be moved to drydock. SFDPP is being re-evaluated and will be in place for the 2023-2024 recertifications. We wish to have a better plan than what we have now, but not as far as some would like it to be. It is all in the information gathering phase so we still need more time and information. The AB recently was presented with a new plan and it is in process to be implemented by Educational Services. We are working with our

global members to help keep the compliance moving forward and will create a team to work with the CDP to ensure this.

INFORMATION SERVICES UPDATE

Commodore Erin Poole as Chief of Information Services (CIS) continues to work hard to protect our database and has stabilized it. Her team is researching potential new databases platforms to replace our outdated database, and may have a resolution potentially by late spring. At this time, it is more stable than it has ever been. Erin has developed and built a great team to support her and is working on the "what's next." To see the organization of IS, visit the Organization Chart posted on SFI.org.

CompOps has completed back-end updates. Some of our automated forms like Promotions and Humanoid Resources were not functioning properly, but all has been stabilized. The membership application online and the new membership certificate are working now.

OPERATIONS/SHOC UPDATES

Operations has implemented the Accelerated Program with a new timeline. We look forward to seeing the effect and look forward to seeing how it will allow long-term growth of incoming chapters fleetwide.

ADMIRALTY BOARD

The Regional Coordinator Manual final draft has been presented to the Admiralty Board without comment. As of this writing, the elections are in process for R3 and R15. If you don't participate in your representation, then you have no excuse if you don't like what you see.

VCS UPDATES

The office of the VCS is ready to present a new manual for current and future AB members, bringing it more in line with the By-Laws and adding updates that were submitted in the last revision but not included.

COMMUNICATIONS UPDATES: RETURN OF THE STARFLEET NEWSLETTER AWARDS

The new Communications Chief. Admiral Lucy Ferron-Franck, is preparing the next iteration of the CQ. The data cutoff for the next issue was Feb 1 and the data has been prepared for MailChimp. She now adds back the Newsletter Awards and continues to improve her department. We thank her for all her hard work and for what she has accomplished in such a short time. As a reminder, all members will receive the CQ via email. You will also be able to download a PDF version of the CQ via the current methods if you do not receive it delivered to you. If you opt out of the MailChimp mailing, you will have to get the communications via download or the Business Only Facebook group. Links will be provided to those also via the Discord channels.

FINANCE

The transition of the corporate bank accounts has been completed to a new institution, RELAY Bank. This will allow for better use globally and for future transitions.

LEGAL UPDATE

We have a modified relationship with the current law offices. We will now have a new legal representative working with SFI and providing hourly cost savings focusing on our Non-Profit status. We have provided a new good faith retainer. The previous retainer was appropriately used up by the previous administration. This is not a bad thing, just good business practices to ensure a collaborative working relationship.

STARFLEET PRODUCTION SERVICES

STARFLEET News had their third broadcast and it just gets better and better. I offer props to Captain Chris Poole for his quality production. The SFI Production team presented the first broadcast of a new program, STARFLEET Now!

It included the second installment of "The Women in STARFLEET," and the second half of the program was a discussion/Q&A featuring myself, VCS Ryan Case, and our new Chief of Information Services (formerly CompOps) Commodore Erin Poole, regarding a recent issue of a GDPR/ SFDPP violation that will be detailed here in the CQ. If you missed the live broadcast, go check it out on the SFI YouTube Channel. The STARFLEET Now broadcast is the mechanism to provide actions to the Core Values that this administration presented in 2022, and we hope that you all enjoy the show. So far the feedback has been positive.

VOLUNTEER RESOURCES, FORMERLY HUMANOID RESOURCES

Want to try your hand at volunteering at the fleet level? Positions open up frequently. I have just closed the posting for Director of Diversity and an announcement will be coming soon.

MEMBERSHIP SERVICES (MS)

It has been a busy couple of months, with the new team of leaders who are all working hard to get everything up to speed and easy to navigate the site. Individual permissions were removed and reset twice due to a SFDPP/GDPR breach. The Helpdesk created new

permission packages that will now be used versus granting individual permissions. If you lost permissions that you still need, you are required to put in a help desk ticket. The new staffing there makes for a much shorter turn around, and MS is much more responsive than it has ever been.

STARFLEET BRANDING

We are just beginning the process of imprinting the isolinear chips on our brand and compliance. Search on

social media for STARFLEET and you will know it is the organization that you belong to. Tell that to all. We are STARFLEET and that is the real McCoy! Creating a new look for your chapter? Engage with the Corps of Engineers and you will find amazing talent that can work with you and the SFI branding to add a cohesive look for all to be impressed.

DEPARTMENT OF AUXILIARY SERVICES (DAS)

The Director of Auxiliary Services is working hard to add supplements to your fandom with specialties like Medical, Tactical, Marines, Special Ops, Intelligence, Diplomats, and even a place for your beloved pet. So much more is on the View Screen for the future. Are you an individual of faith? Do you have a dream of promoting a new facet to what IDIC is all about? I want to hear about it and help you design a program through the wisdom of the DAS to add to the fun and participation of what STARFLEET's core values are all about.

My Chief of Staff reported that the GoFundMe that was setup for Sal Lizard, former CS of STARFLEET, with a goal of \$1,000, was closed out. Thanks to all who donated, we exceeded that goal and on Feb 15th. Sal received a final amount of \$1,515 after GFM fees via PayPal. He was very grateful and thanks everyone who donated.

Greetings STARFLEET!

I want to thank you all, one final time, for giving me the opportunity to serve you as the VCS and Corporate Secretary of the organization. I endeavor to make you proud of that decision with each of my own.

To get down to business, the VCS team has coordinated with the Scholarship Committee Lead, Rob Hunnicutt, and Information Services, Jayden Tyronian, to add clarity to the SFI scholarship page. The website now has its own page for scholarships and clearly defines the criteria and differences between internal and external scholarships. The application process is smoother; instead of an embedded application of limited usage, the application can now be submitted as an applicant package starting with the application on the website.

My Chief of Staff, Lauren White, and I led the reinvigoration of the STARFLEET Archives Department, headed by Eugene Sanford. Archives has built up its team and completed an updated history of STARFLEET. The presentation of his work is to be posted on the Archives website depicting each Commander, STARFLEET and International Conferences back to the organization's inception. Archives also encourages submittals of historical

documents and photos to the Facebook page.

The major undertaking of my first quarter in office has been updates to STARFLEET documents including the Membership Handbook, the STARFLEET Data Protection Policy (SFDPP) Manual, Bylaws, and RC Manual. Of specific note, the Membership Handbook is being completely overhauled and reorganized for submission to the Admiralty Board in April. The Bylaws have beén amended to align with the recent membership vote changes. One item I want to mention, now, prior to any conversations that can and will need to happen: A number of MHB and Bylaws statements and policies just simply disagree, and it has mostly to do with the fact of how long it takes to change the Bylaws to deal with an ever changing world. Please know, now, that you will likely be seeing more changes to the Bylaws requested during this administration.

In keeping with these updating tasks, I've been working closely with the CS to determine and maintain compliance with STARFLEET policies. This includes a deep dive to determine who is in compliance with the SFDPP courses and taking the necessary corrective action for those who were not. It has also required a scrub of the STARFLEET database to remove unnecessary member permissions, assign correct permission packages, remove non-member access, and

cleanse the database of inactive members with extensive permissions. The process hasn't been quick or funbut has been necessary.

Mercifully, much is behind us already, and there are still many months of the fun part to come. There is just a lot to get squared away to make that possible. Despite the tediousness of necessity, I love this job, I love this organization - and I look forward to interacting with more of you as the months go by.

We are honored to have been given the opportunity to serve again, and we are hoping to not only continue our work, but improve what we have to offer through review, revision, and growth.

We have instituted an Academia Council, consisting of the CES, Deputy CES/SFA Commandant, SFA Vice Commandant, SFMCA Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent, the ES Chief of staff, and the ES Information Services/ Webmaster. This group will meet on a regular basis to help the two bodies work together, and determine how the ES Department can best serve the membership.

We are pleased to report some numbers for both SFA and SFMCA for 2022. SFA had just over 900 students, and those students took almost 20,000 courses. SFMCA had over 150 students, who took over 1,700 courses. This means that the students in these Academies took approximately 21,700 courses last year. Honestly, this is phenomenal, and I hope the trend continues.

As many of you are already aware, we have recently resumed the Boothby program, which had to be temporarily paused because of the blackout period. SFA Awards Director Franklin Newman has been working hard to clear out the backlog and get the missing certificates to the members. This will likely take a few more weeks, after which he will be back to his schedule of issuing Boothbys that are earned at least once a month. Please be aware that at this time, he can only issue Boothbys based on the courses that are in the database. As the imports for the remaining institutes are finished, he will be issuing more certificates based on the addition of those courses.

Now for some news from both Academies:

SFA NEWS:

We have had some people come and go from our staff in recent months, and we have had to say goodbye to Richard Rutledge, Josephine Fisher, Joseph Sare, and Alicia Muhammad. All served with honor, and we are sorry to see them go. I want to especially recognize Josephine, who retired after 15 years of service to SFA ... what dedication!

The following members have joined SFA staff: Deacon Grall, Gregory Franklin, Michael Malotte, Cory Clay, James Herring, and Simon Henderson. Some of these members I have worked with before, others I have not, but I believe we will see great things from all of them.

There have been some curriculum changes as well. Probably the biggest of those is the closing of the College of Medical Knowledge. This was a hard decision, but in the end, it was determined that while it was a good addition when it was first opened, much of the material is duplicated in other colleges, and it was best for all concerned that it be retired. This was done with the full knowledge and cooperation of STARFLEET Medical, and they have made appropriate adjustments in their certification requirements.

Another upcoming change is the reopening of a college that had previously been retired, but we want to give another chance to find a place in the curriculum; the College of Military Movies. Our hope is that by the time this issue of the CQ is released, the college will have opened, or be very close to opening. This will include some of the courses from the School (formerly College) of John Wayne in the College of Action and Drama Movies, as well as a number of courses from the original college. The staff plan to add some other offerings as well, and have a plan for continuing to add and grow this college. We have some other colleges that are currently closed that we hope will be reopening soon, after undergoing review and revision.

Speaking of review and revision, we are working on plans to adopt a schedule that will result in all of our courses being reviewed and revised if necessary, at least once during this Fleet administration. Naturally, courses such as OTS, OCC, SFDPP, and FOS

will be revised as often as is necessary to keep up with changes in the organization, our policies, and documents. Our hope is that a review at least every three years is a policy that will stay in place even after TJ and I have moved on from these positions.

Our staff is continuing to program more courses into the Quiz Activity Module (QAM) system, as we are aware that most students prefer this method of taking exams. The vast majority of those will be auto-graded instantly by the system, but there will be some that are manually graded because of the nature of the exam (such as OCC, which we plan to have in QAM format very soon). We appreciate everyone's patience while we do this, as it is rather time consuming and cannot be rushed. Since some members do prefer using the PDFs and sending those back to the Directors, that will of course continue to be an option.

Regarding finishing the importing of grades from the blackout period – we understand that this has taken far longer than anyone anticipated, and that members are frustrated. Please believe me when I say that the staff is just as frustrated as the students. SFA is working closely with the Department of Information Services to finish the imports as soon as is reasonably possible. Information about the dates of the blackout period and the institutes that have been imported to date is available on Moodle (indeed, it is available on the login page without having to actually log in).

We do have some openings for Assistant Directors in SFA. We maintain a job listing with the Volunteer Resources department (https://sfi.org/humanoidresources/) and anyone wishing to join our staff can apply at any time. When we have Director or higher openings, we will post those to the site separately.

SFMCA NEWS

SFMCA has had some major staffing changes. We have had to saygoodbye to Chris Boggs, who left the position of Superintendent to take on the challenge of Deputy Commandant of the SFMC. He will be missed, but we are sure he will do an outstanding job in his new position. Moving up to replace him is Michael Malotte, who

previously served as the Deputy Superintendent. Michael Timko has been chosen as the new Deputy Superintendent. These two gentlemen are the primary reason that all of the 14 schools currently in SFMCA are completely programmed into QAM, and I know they will continue to do great work in these new positions. (Please note; even though all of the courses in SFMCA are in QAM, there are some that are still manually graded by the Director, and therefore takes additional time to grade.)

With the staffing changes, this has also caused some changes to the membership of the Review Board (staff members who review all new materials before release, similar to the Course Development Committee in SFA). Michael Timko, as Deputy Superintendent, is the chair of the board, and Michael Malotte and TJ Allen are observers. Currently, the only member is Les Rickard, but they are in the process of selecting a new member from their staff.

Curriculum changes are also coming to SFMCA. Two schools in the Command Staff College will be reopened once the revisions are complete: Combined Arms and Military History. Also, the Cadet Program is being completely revamped to have multiple levels and multiple branches, and is in beta testing. Plans are underway to have all manuals and courses reviewed (and revised if needed) before the end of the year. The plan is to do this annually.

There are multiple openings for Assistant Directors. Similar to SFA, a general listing will be maintained with Volunteer Resources (https://sfi.org/humanoidresources/) any time that there are openings.

That wraps up things for ES for this issue.

If you are currently a student, then hopefully you will continue your studies with us. If you have taken courses in the past, please consider coming back and seeing what we have to offer that perhaps you didn't see before. If you

have not started your studies yet, now is a great time to visit our campus and check out what we have to offer.

On February 18th 2023

a new Chief of Information Services was appointed. The first order of business was to examine the strengths and weaknesses of the current team and bring in new members to create something well rounded and capable. After the team was structured and put in place, we worked to resolve the website redirect and access issues we were having. Those are now resolved and the sites are working as expected. New member application forms are also now available. Member cards and Certificates are updated in the database to reflect the current executive leadership team. Our Members Hub has been updated to include information on new chapters in the fleet. We are looking for material to

add to the Promotions and Announcements section, and will continue to grow the Members Hub area in the coming months. There is also now access to all STARFLEET group pages on social media in the Members Hub area.

A team has been assembled and work has begun on the new database project. The overall approach is to create something that can be maintained more easily than the current platform. The more information the better to assist the Commander, STARFLEET and the Admiralty Board determine whether an investigation is warranted.

to check out all of the STARFLEET Auxiliary Services and their many, and varied, offerings. What are these 'Auxiliary Services' you may ask? Simply put they are a group of fellow members that came together with an idea for a specific way to enjoy, or serve the fandom, that is SFI. From a specific 'flavor perspective,' they provide common activities, or an outright new service to the organization. Over the years these took many names and structures: the old holodéck program, STARS, or just left to be a thing over which the VCS, or no one, had any oversight. Now they are organized under Section 10 of the current (as of this writing) MHB.

Last year, then Commander, STARFLEET, Steven Parmley, proposed a new position to the AB – the Director of Auxiliary Services (DAS). It is my job to oversee all these programs - to help them grow, to make new ones as needed, and bring these services to the entire organization. I have to say, I love it, it's one of the most rewarding things I've done for SFI.

Currently we have nine such services, in various stages of maturity.

Four are permanent Auxiliary Services - programs so mature, they are codified in the Membership Handbook:

STARFLEET Marine Corps (SFMC)

- for those who love a more military flavor to their sci-fi and Trek. Our oldest, and most mature program. It was once its own separate organization and chose to join SFI!

STARFLEET Special Operations (SFSO) - for those who love a more

'fast action' flavor to their fandom, coupled with a serious love of academy courses.

STARFLEET Medical (SFMD) - Not just because McCoy was, and shall be, my first doctor (and sarcastic mentor), this is for those that both enjoy the medical world on Star Trek, but also want to see those advances happen.

STARFLEET Petfleet (SFPT?...we're working on that) - Why limit our enjoyment of fandom to just humans? Dogs are people too, and cat's, while I find them mostly unpleasant, are no worse than many of the human's I've met. Plus so many more. I hear we have dolphins and rocks too!

We also have several in various other stages of maturity:

STARFLEET Sciences (SFSC) - We are a Star Trek club after all, and geeking out about science is kind of a given. Within this is also Stellar Cartography - and I hope many more science focus areas to come as this Service grows.

STARFLEET Corps of Engineers (SFCoE) - My Baby. My pride and joy. The main reason I wanted my current job as DAS - so we could start this much needed thing. Many had ideas for it before - but I wanted it to be bigger. Erin Poole (now the CIS) and Ryan Case (now VCS) wrote the proposal (and rewrote and rewrote to get bigger and bigger) to make a service that connects anything and everything 'maker'. If you have a creative hobby - odds are it has a place in the Corps of Engineers. And not just to socialize and share crafting pictures - oh no - it's a resource to ask all the creative types that want to help.

STARFLEET Diplomatic Corps (SFDC) - Currently under some reorganization, but the vision is to collect the SFI members that are interested in researching, contacting, and maintaining relationships and information about external fan organizations and events (conventions and the like). It is intended to build a resource for all to use.

STARFLEET Tactical (SFTA) -

Another long overdue service. Started before, but it is now restarted with a much broader vision. If you game with a fellow member of SFI, or want to, this should be a help. Game or game event organization and help with that, looking for group/games, and mentorship of games are some of the proposed objectives. It's early, but that is the vision.

STARFLEET Intelligence (SFIN) - Like the above SFDC, this is looking to be a research group and resource to members, only this time looking to help with member driven 'intel requests', and a repository for answers. Every alien culture in Trek - yup, we want to build a wiki for where to get answers (not just duplicate Memory Alpha). Do you need help chasing down a trivial trek fact, or information on an event in your area? Eventually, these should be the 'intel agents' to help you with that.

I'll let them all invite you to check them out in greater detail; but these focus groups have been some of the best things I have enjoyed about SFI over the years - and now I love that my job is to see them grow, and align with member needs.

This is in keeping with the vision of Gene Roddenberry by being dedicated to helping humankind attain noble goals and ideals, and lead by example through service and teamwork as illustrated in the TV

series

Current medical research and trends are regularly shared on our Facebook page and on Discord, and any SFI member in good standing may apply to become a member.

In addition to the Surgeon General, there are other members of STARFLEET Medical with various duties— such as leads in public health, men and women's health, wellness, research and development, and emergency preparedness. Members of STARFLEET Medical work collaboratively with SFI Regional leadership and like-minded STARFLEET International members to promote health in the community, raise awareness in public health matters, along with promoting safety in the home. Each core level consists of ten (10) courses, giving a total of 100 courses to be completed.

REPORT: STARFLEET INTELLIGENCE

STARFLEET Intelligence is not Section 31,

or any other take on previous efforts under the same, or similar names. This is to be a true service to the membership and the fleet.

STARFLEET Intelligence (SFIN) will focus in two main areas: Intelligence Requests, and an "Intelligence Database".

Intelligence requests will be just that a form (coming soon!) that members can fill out to get help looking up information, either about Trek, or about events or organizations in their area. The latter would usually be in support of some event. For instance, your chapter is going to a convention and you've been invited to host a panel on organized fandom. SFIN can help you look for other fan orgs in the area that you may want to reach out to, to be on your panel. Or maybe you want to go to a convention but are unsure what is in your area. This sort of question can be made as a request to SFIN. Of course, for anything involving other

organizations, they would work with STARFLEET Diplomatic Corps.

Now the 'Intel database' is the other aspect and involves research. We're going to attempt to have a wiki, with a page for each culture in Trek, and compile a running list of resources for SFI members to use. We call it the "Four C's." Each of the Alien race pages will have four sections of information: Calendar (any known significant events, holidays, etc.), Cuisine (food and drink!), Costuming (resources for that specific Alien's style), and Culture (basic facts). This is NOT a Memory Alpha replacement, but more a collection of where to find information.

Jason Garrett is going to lead this effort, and soon will have posts open on the HR website. (STARFLEET Intelligence reports that there may have been hostile intentions and actions from a fringe group of Cardassian Obsidian Order survivors). A lot of work will also be some internal organizing, until the website is ready to take requests, and start organizing this cultural data.

If you have ever gotten lost on the Memory Alpha (or Beta) website for hours... you should come be an Intelligence agent. If you've ever wanted to organize data into logical, useful, easily referenceable systems... you should be an intelligence agent. Potatoes and Onions Side Dish

INGREDIENTS

- 2 big russet (baking) potatoes.2 large or four medium onions, either sweet Vidalia or yellow.
- 1-3 ounces of extra virgin olive oil in the bottle.
- Teaspoon or so of basil in the shaker.
- Teaspoon or so of oregano in the
- shaker.
- Teaspoon or so of powdered garlic

OR

A tablespoon of minced garlic.

For a Fahrenheit conventional oven, preheat the oven to 375 degrees.

Get out either a round pizza pan with edges or a long rectangular sheet pan with sides.

Wash the potatoes in water, cutting off any eyes. Keep the skin on. Dice the potatoes into half inch cubes by cutting the potatoes in half, then taking each half and cutting them into half inch slices, then cut the slices into half inch pieces. Spread the pieces evenly on the sheet pan.

Then, take the onion, cut it in half top to bottom and remove the outer skin layers until it doesn't have any dry pieces of skin left. Take one half of the onion and cut thru the onion in angles to form wedges of onion. If they are more than a quarter inch wide, cut the wedges in half so you have two thinner wedges. Repeat with each onion. Toss out any green onion parts from the wedge centers.

Place the onion wedges evenly thru the potato pieces, until the sheet is covered.

Drizzle the extra virgin olive oil thinly over the potato & onion pieces until all pieces have some oil on them.

Sprinkle the basil, oregano and garlic powder onto the mixture.

Note: If you're using the minced garlic, spoon a little bit (very small groups) around the mixture at this time instead of the garlic powder.

Put the sheet into the oven for 35 to 40 minutes at 375 degrees Fahrenheit.

If they aren't done and are not as soft inside as you want, after you turn the oven off, put the sheet back into the heated but OFF oven for five minutes, then take the potato and onion mixture out of the oven.

They should be done!

NOTE: If you want an easier way to do this, see if you can find red skinned potatoes in the frozen fries section of your local grocery store and substitute those for the dicing potatoes part, but keeping the rest. You might not need to use as much seasoning this way.

Endive Warp Nacelles With Crab Nebula

Separate the leaves of a head of Belgian endive, wash and trim, and place on tray, concave upwards. Fill with Crab Nebula.

INGREDIENTS

- 1-2 heads Belgian endive
- 4 ounces cream cheese
- 3 tbsp. sour cream (Alternative is mayonnaise)
- 1 tsp lemon juice
- ½ tsp seasoning (salt, pepper, paprika, celery seed, ground mustard, nutmeg, ginger, allspice, cloves, cinnamon)
- 8 ounces crabmeat (1 can) or 1 package crab 'sea-legs', chopped.
- 2 tbsp chives

CRAB NEBULA

- 1. Blend cream cheese, sour cream, lemon juice and seasoning.
- 2. Fold in lump crab meat or sea-legs.
- 3. Fold in chopped chives.

Cranberry, Orange & Pecan Muffins

INGREDIENTS

- 2 1/3 cups almond flour
- 1/3 cup coconut flour
- ½ tsp baking soda
- 2 eggs
- 1 tbsp. orange zest
- 1 tsp vanilla extract

- ½ cup orange juice
- ½ cup honey
- 2 tbsps. coconut oil, melted
- 1 cup cranberries
- 1 cup pecans, chopped

For a Fahrenheit conventional oven, preheat the oven to 375 degrees.

STEPS

- Preheat oven to 175 degrees
 Celsius (350 degrees Fahrenheit)
 and line a muffin tray with paper
 liners.
- In a mixing bowl, add the eggs, vanilla, melted coconut oil, honey, orange juice and zest. Add the baking soda on top of the orange juice so that it begins to foam and then add in the flours and stir on low speed until just combined,

- don't over mix.
- Using a spoon, gently stir in the fresh cranberries and chopped pecans.
- 4. Fill each muffin cup to the top with batter and gently press down on the batter to make sure the cups are firmly filled. Top each muffin with a few extra cranberries to make them look pretty.
- 5. Bake in the oven for approximately 25 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Allow the muffins to cool completely for at least 20 minutes before removing from the tins.

TREK TECH

We are the lucky ones. We know what is coming in the area of tech. Someone somewhere mentions something that they think is "out there," or "never gonna happen," and we just sit quietly and know. We have seen it. It's in every ship we know inside and out. It's in every win and every defeat. It's what lets our favourite show be.

Welcome...to Trek Tech.

Technology can advance at various paces. Sometimes it can burst onto the scene as an idea and within a few years can be something that we are not surprised to hear about any more. Other ones take a slow burn to get into the collective consciousness, going through many iterations before they become something that we are used to. The speed at which something goes from thought, to paper, to prototype, to usable tech, can also depend on what we are going be using that tech for. It can, sometimes. depend on what is the driving force behind the thinking.

'Necessity is the mother of invention', first said in some form by Plato. Is it something that we think we need, right now, to make life better for ourselves or someone else? Is it something to ensure that we can beat "the other guy?" Is it something to get us from where we are, to where we need to be?

At other times, technology comes about because someone thinks "What would happen if we did this?" or "Wouldn't it be good if we could do this?" Not out of any thought of financial gain, not out of the need to take something that isn't ours, not out of the need to be better than the other guy. Just because we can, because we want to see what happens if we do. It might not work. It might be a stupid idea. It might have already been done in some form that we don't know about...but who cares? We had a dream and we gave it a go, who knows where we would be if people hadn't dreamed?

Star Trek came from the dream of one man, and where would any of us here

be without the great Gene Roddenberry and our Trek? His vision gave us some of the most amazing technology ever seen before Star Trek and allowed other people to see that their dreams could also be true. Here was a universe where tech helped everyone, where it was used to better the whole of mankind instead of just the individual, where we didn't need to make money any more...where we could just be the best we could be.

Every issue of the CQ, I will be delving deep into a technology that is a normal part of life and commonplace in Star Trek. I will be looking at what we have today that is equivalent to that tech and what we are using it for at the moment. Is it still a thought in the head of some dreamer? Has it moved onto theory? Have we seen the first versions of it coming out? We will look at why we are interested in that specific tech, bearing in mind that we are still, as a species, barbarian humans who like money and fame. We will weigh the scales on what it could contribute to us at this moment in time, or what it is contributing if we already have working versions. Will it be good for us, could it be used for something

On this Edition of THE INTERVUE,

our guest has quite the resume. I am so honored to be talking with him today of all great days, the start of my magazine The Rogers Revue (therogersrevue.com) 14th Anniversary. He started his career in 1994 playing Rickie Vasquez on the critically acclaimed series "My So-Called Life." He has gone on to greater things with TV stints in "Red Band Society," "Party of Five" and "10 Reasons Why;" and to movies like "Supernova" & "Party Monster."

On stage, he has been in "A Perfect Wedding," "Tick Tick Boom," and the character Angel in one of my favorite musicals, "Rent." But for those countless Star Trek fans, myself included out there, he is Dr. Hugh Culber on *Star Trek: Discovery*, which is currently playing on Paramount+.

He was one of the guests at the Farpoint Convention, which celebrated its 30th anniversary in mid-February. I have with me the one, the only, Wilson Cruz!



Wilson, its an honor to be talking with you on THE INTERVUE!
Thank you for having me. It's a pleasure to be here with you.

Star Trek: Discovery has been firing on all cylinders and has jumpstarted the Trek television boom that we have been seeing since 2017. My first question to you is what has piqued your interest in playing Dr. Hugh Culber and how has he evolved throughout the four seasons we have seen so far. You know, not only has he as a character evolved, but more my experience playing him has also been an evolution because as everyone knows, at this point, I started out as just a recurring character. I was just basically Mr. Stamets' boyfriend for most of the time for the first season, until the terrible, terrible thing happened. And believe it or not, for me, that was really where it began, that's where, for me, we really began to figure out who this person is because he needed to figure out who he was, in order to come back to life in order to find his way back to Paul.

And so, it was through the process of being reborn, and finding out for himself what it means to be in the world again. And to have a second chance to live that he started to understand what was important to him and what wasn't. And as an actor, it was really fun to figure out what those things were, how to play them, and how to create a three-dimensional person. And so, with the writers and the producers and the show runners, we really started to understand that the beating heart, if you will, of this crew that he was very much in tune with the emotional roller coaster that these people have been on, and has

been really willing to step up and guide them through it.

The fact that he died and came back, gave him some gravitas in the eyes of this crew that allowed them to trust him in a way that they hadn't even trusted that they hadn't trusted him before. So, short answer to I gotta make it succinct. The entire storyline has been about evolution, it has been about evolving into the person that you want to become, and being in the driver's seat of your life, not being driven by your circumstances. But taking advantage of the circumstances that you find yourself in to create the kind of life that you deserve. And that's how I think that's how I see him.

I definitely applaud you for the answer. It's like the Tasha Yar syndrome, she had to die on her series in The Next Generation in order to get the best episodes. And your character has really evolved, from a background character to playing one of the main characters, especially going through life, death, and rebirth.

And now you're doing double duty, not only as the doctor, but you're also the ship's counselor, especially since the crew went from their home century to the 32nd century. I love the fact that he got to give some advice to the crew with Saru, to encourage them to have that crew dinner that went berserk to the movie time we have seen. How did you prepare to do double duty by playing a ship's doctor and a counselor looking after the crew's mental health?

For me, I feel like by the time we arrive into the 32nd century, as a species, I hope that by then the medical world...

will own the fact that we aren't just a series of blood vessels and organs. If we are going to look at a person's health that we need to look at it in a holistic way that their mental health is as important as their physical health and how do those two things work together, in order to make a person healthy and able to, you know, walk through the world and get all of the things done that they need to do. And the minute we start looking at people in a holistic way, and own the fact that person's mental health is just as important. I think we start to really heal people, we really start to get to the crux of whatever their issue is.

I think Hugh understands that in a personal way. And because he saw himself through his own trauma, he if he could identify the trauma that his fellow crew members were experienced and really needed to step up in a way that only he could do. I think he also understood that he had the kind of relationship with his crew that would allow them to go through that process with him specifically. Also, it's just for me as an actor, those scenes are my favorite scenes. To have one on one conversations, in depth conversations with these other people, these other characters and get them to a good place with who and where they are. That's interesting material to play.

The first person that I really got to go in with, was David Ajala. To develop, what Culber's therapy session style is with that level of actor was really a gift. And to follow it up with Mary Wiseman, and talk to Tilly and find and help her focus and see what's important to her. Those two experiences with those therapy sessions really helped me understand what kind of a therapist, Dr. Culber is. He's not just an empathetic person, but he's someone who walks into these sessions with a goal, right? He doesn't walk into them blindly. He knows where he wants to get with them and where he wants them to get with him. He has a finesse about him. A big beating heart that allows people to trust him. It's been exciting for me!

It's been amazing, to tell you the truth, to watch you the last couple of seasons.

I'm really looking forward to people seeing Dr. Culber and season five, because we get to see so much. We get to see even more of a fuller picture of who he is in. And there are our new sides to him that are exciting for me to discover. And I think we're going to be great for people to watch.

Anthony and I, you know, I'm not a dad now, but you know, my friend now is.

We definitely cannot wait, especially since he's really evolved in the last couple of seasons. Since you touched on the scenes you shared with David and Mary, the one thing that I love about Hugh is the chemistry with Anthony as Paul. but also working with Adira and Grey play by Blu (del Barrio) and lan (Alexander). It brings this new dynamic of family that only Star Trek can give the positive light that we need to see as society. And I want you to talk about how that development of this found family progresses during season four. Did you experience any hiccups or conflicts to make sure it's portrayed right and as portrayed well? You know, I think that so much of it

kind of came about naturally from out of Anthony and I's relationship with Blu & Ian. There was a natural mentoring relationship between these two queer actors with these two older queer actors who also started out as young people in this industry. And so, we felt like we really wanted to protect them, but also set them up for success. I think that dynamic was really interesting to the writers. And so, it just kind of developed very naturally.

And that's what I love about it because I think that's how found families are created right? They start out as someone you know, into someone you can't live without. That someone who informs your life in ways that you didn't even know you needed. And for

Up until then, I think there was something that we wanted to nurture in ourselves that we were being responsible to our young queer actors who were having a new experience.

We wanted to ensure that it was a better experience than we had when we were young and queer in this industry, which was hard. I love seeing how that has played out in in the show, because in very similar ways, our relationship with Blu and Grey is about allowing them to live up to their potential as crew members on this ship. We'll continue to see that as the seasons progress.

It seems like it's passing the torch because almost thirty years ago, with your role as Rickie in "My So-Called Life", it was just nineteen episodes still has a great following. And you are the first openly gay actor to portray an openly gay teen on network primetime television. I want to know, after almost thirty years now, what does Rickie mean to you now, and the legacy that you have brought to the world that you have set a path for gay actors & characters today?

No, but you know, I hear you think, first of all, thank you for it for that question. Not only did I play the first, when not only was the first actor to play an openly gay teenager, I was the first openly gay actor to play any openly...

gay role. So, it wasn't just teen. I only say that because it's still amazing to me that it took up until 1994 for that to happen. I didn't even know at the time that that was true. We didn't realize that or I didn't realize that until I was researching my own documentary series called Visible: Out on Television, which is on Apple TV+. During the research for that documentary series is when we found out that the person that I was trying to find out like who was the first person it was actually me.

So what does it mean to me, it means and has always meant everything to me, because Rickie Vasquez. People come up to me, if not daily than weekly, but at least online daily, someone will come up to me to tell me how important he is to them and what he meant to them in their journey of self-acceptance and identity. My very first thought is, he changed my life. I had to become the kind of person who was worthy of playing Rickie Vasquez. I knew that when I took on the role that I was going to have to be out that I was gonna have to talk about that publicly.

I had to put all of the pieces in place in my personal life in order to make that happen, which also included coming out to my parents and that experience ended up in forming the character. So, there was this very symbiotic relationship between me and Rickie Vasquez. I know that no matter what I do, you know, whether it be Hugh Culber, or Dr. Juanito Vargas on "Noah's Arc" or Angel in "Rent", I'm always going to be Rickie Vasquez and that's fine with me more than fine. I'm proud to carry the mantle, if you will of that because I think for so many of us epitomize how troublesome are our youths were in that period of time in history.

The 90s were this very exciting time, in terms of political power, that came through visibility, but it was also a time in which we were losing our young men in numbers that are hard to imagine today to AIDS. So, there was a lot going on. And Rickie kind of allowed us to see that journey and appreciate it and learn from it and be inspired by it. And that's what he continues to do for me even today.

Now I'm gonna have a tough time asking which next question I want to ask because you touch on two

important things I really want to ask about. Since I can tell you speaking of Angel, "Rent" is one of my favorite musicals of all time. I'm glad you have the honor of portraying Angel. And I can tell you, honestly, I'm trying not to cry but now thinking about it, how Angel's death when it was portrayed on stage and in the film, it reminded me so much of my mother, because lost my mother to AIDS twenty-five years ago now. So sorry.

Thank you, and you played such characters on film and television. What changes have you seen within the industry regarding the inclusion of actors and actresses of color, and of the LGBTQ+ community and how they're portrayed from the 90s to where we are right now, in 2023? You know, I think when we look back at the roles, the queer roles back in the 90s, and in the, even in the 2000s, so much of that storytelling was an attempt to reach people, to get them to empathize and to understand us as a community. And that was important, it continues to be important. The stories we tell whether they be on film, or in the theater, or, on big screens or small, allow people in their homes, or in their personal experiences, to walk a little bit in our shoes and try our lives on for a bit and empathize with what our experience has been. And that is incredibly important.

I think now, in 2023, our community has earned the right to ask for more joy, for stories that have less to do with our traumas, and more to do with our

victories, and our loves and our relationships and more stories for us, by us because we deserve that. I think we find ourselves in this moment, kind of navigating between stories that still inform and invite people in, and stories that allow us to see ourselves and take stock of our experience. I am definitely one who is advocating for more queer joy in our storytelling. I hope to be a part of that.

And you are a part of it right now, within Star Trek. I read that you are a big yoga person. How does yoga help with your soul and with your center?

Oh, I can't start my day. First of all, my back won't allow me, my 50-year-old back won't allow me. So much of my work really is about connecting with other people and finding that connection in order to tell a story. So much of my advocacy is about speaking out for those who can't speak for themselves. My yoga practice is about "How do I get in touch with me?" "What do I need in this moment?" "How am I well, how am I not well?" "What ways can I help myself manage a crisis better?"

There's a power in acknowledging your own breath and being grateful for it in the moment, that's what yoga does for me. It also allows me to recover from my heavy lifting days in a way that allows me to go back to the gym and feel some progress. I'll be 50 this year and I feel it every time I go to the gym, I'm like, "oh, yeah, this is harder now". My yoga practice is about centering myself and it does that in meaningful ways. I honestly can't go to work until I do it right. I have to be centered in myself so that I can show up fully for my scene partner when I'm in that scene.

I have to admit, I'm jealous of you because when I looked at your Instagram, you recently went to France, posted beautiful shots. If you were to recommend tips for me for my upcoming trip to France, which I'm hoping to do, in a couple years or so, what advice would you give me to have an amazing trip? Well, I don't know how long you're going for, but I will say this, the thing that I loved about my trip was that I got to spend a good amount of time in Paris. And do that, right, like do Paris and see the big sights and be a...

tourist and then on our way back to Paris to go to the airport, we stopped in another town called oz there. All of that to say, I really got a real a larger view of France, not just the Metropolitan France, but rural areas and small towns and these old cobblestone streets and these homes that have been there for older than the United States that itself. I really got a perspective of the of the country and enough to make me want to go back and explore you in more. I would, advise you to get out of the metropolitan areas and kind of experience some of the country. Walk, walk everywhere, I walked everywhere in Paris

You're right about that. I did the same thing when I went to England my first and second time that even though my friend lives in Hertfordshire & Coventry, the times I was there, I was able to see a whole lot more of the countryside, experience the culture instead of just being in London for the entire seven days. I got to experience this whole site and it gave me such an appreciation for England that I never thought I would experience. That's the way to visit a place I think I really think it's like on your feet and get out of metropolitan areas and experience the real country, the real people.

Now you and I have a commonality and it has to do with Meredith Vieira, you have been on "25 Words or Less" as the celebrity. I actually was on Who Wants to Be a Millionaire.

Yes. I love Meredith. She just had a birthday just last month, but I just love her to death. She's just good real people, right? I could hang with her there and she puts on no airs.

Not all, especially when I met her. I think it was about five or seven years afterwards. And I told her it's great to see you again. You helped me win 64,000 And she gave me the biggest hug that she's ever given me.

Yeah, I love a game show. And I actually did a bunch more of "25 Words or Less". I think there'll be airing in like March or April, but we made them last year. Yeah, I love that game.

Are you a big fan of game shows and games in general when it comes to playing or being a contestant? I love a board game like you know, I was babysitting my nephew this morning and he has these card games.

So my last question is this. I know we can talk forever about a lot of things. What would you like to say to your fans who have supported you throughout your career from My So-Called Life to Rent to Star Trek Discovery to whatever the future brings for you?


I mean, listen, it is not lost on me that there was nothing in my story as a young person, to lead me to believe that I would be so fortunate to have a career that has spanned thirty years. When I first did "My So-Called Life", I was like, if this is the only thing I ever get to do, it will have been enough. So, everything after that has been a gift. Hugh Culber has been the most fascinating, complex, shockingly surprising character I have played to this day, he continues to surprise me. And I'm just grateful to people for going on this ride with me on my personal ride as an openly gay actor, to continue to have this career but also that they've gone on this crazy Hugh Culber roller coaster and that they've got they've gone all in with me. You have to suspend all kinds of disbelief with this guy. And I do my best to make it as real and believable as I possibly can.


the Antares Christmas party was postponed to the 27th of January when roads were clear enough for the crew to get together.

Star Trek: A Vision of the Future by CAPT Lynn Harper



Since 1967,

Star Trek has provided us with a vision of what the future could be a vision fuelled by the imagination and creativity of many writers and thinkers. Star Trek takes us on a voyage of the human spirit - exploring strange new worlds and civilizations, all the while boldly going where no one has gone before. I can recall watching The Original Series as a child and marvelling at the wonders of each new wondrous gadget. I imagined a world where such things might be possible. Could these things actually come to pass? The answer is - perhaps with time! For Star Trek has been the inspiration of many incredible strides in the field of invention and technological innovation and things which were once simply fantasy have found their way into our modern world. For instance, right now I am dictating this article directly into a word document - I am not hindered by keystrokes - and now I understand how Scotty felt in "The Voyage Home"!

THE PADD

PADDs are shown to be in widespread use since at least the 22nd century in the Star Trek universe. The futuristic computer interface is used to punch in coordinates for star systems, as well as being a recreational tool aboard the ship. Over the years, we have witnessed computers evolve into slim-line, touchscreen devices with significant computing power. Indeed, with the appropriate apps installed, my iPhone can serve as my computer when I am away from my desk, and I can easily access files "in the cloud." Truly, it is difficult to imagine life without this technology!

THE UNIVERSAL TRANSLATOR

As the various crews ventured out beyond the Sol System, it became necessary to communicate with races who did not speak the languages of earth. Hoshi Sato was the first human translator - but she was later supported by the universal translator which allowed for simultaneous translation given just a few cues. I was recently on tour in Europe with my students. I do not speak Czech, Polish or Hungarian with any proficiency; however, with the use of a translation app, I was able to communicate quite effectively with those that I met along the way. Truly, these tools have the capacity to increase the potential for communication and understanding.

THE HYPOSPRAY

Medically speaking, the Hypospray is one of the gadgets commonly used in Star Trek as this medical device speeds up the process of administering medicine by injecting it through the skin using a non-invasive transport mechanism.

In reality, jet injectors have been in existence since the 1960s, and though syringes have not yet been phased out, new technology is constantly being developed. (For more articles on Star Trek medical technologies, please see this month's edition of the *Hypospray!*)

Imagine if you will, technology which could effectively replicate food stuffs... what impact would this have in places where people are without the necessities of life? How might we use this tool to better the lives of all humans? Is this a dream...? Perhaps - but I cannot think of a dream more worthy of our energy.

The Great Bird of the Universe sought to share his Utopian vision of the world and used this "wagon train to the stars" as an allegory of possibilities for all on earth...and beyond. I can only hope that with time we will continue to build on this hopeful vision of the future and bring about the change which is so needed in our world.

I've been to, and enjoyed, every Capital Sci Fi Con - from the inaugural event in 2016 at Meadowbank Stadium, to the now regular venue, the O2 Academy (previously the Corn Exchange).

This is a convention with a focus on fundraising and all profits go to children's charity, CHAS (Children's Hospices). Capital Sci Fi Con fundraises year round with a group of cosplayers and, to date, has raised an incredible total of £337,193.30.


